RESOLUTION OF THE FOSTER TOWN COUNCIL

SUBJECT: OPPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL #7985
LOW AND MODERATE INCOME HOUSING

WHEREAS, the Foster Town Council supports the concept of establishing a goal for a percentage of the housing units in the Town to be classified as low and moderate income housing; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Foster does not have municipal water and sewage facilities which reduces the opportunity for the construction of large multi-unit developments where low and moderate income units could be incorporated; and

WHEREAS, a very high percentage of new home building permits issued in the Town of Foster are for individual residences that do not lend themselves to be constructed and categorized as low and moderate income type units; and

WHEREAS, the Foster Town Council believes the penalty, as outlined in House Bill #7985, of a fine in the amount of \$2,000.00 for each unit below the 10% goal is inappropriate and places an unfair financial burden on the taxpayers of Foster; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Council of the Town of Foster opposes House Bill H-7985 amending current legislation regarding low and moderate income regulations and urges our local legislators to oppose this bill when it comes up before the House, and our Senator, should a companion bill be presented to the Senate.


